Waltz (Minute Waltz) Op. 64 No.1

Frederic Chopin (1810 – 1849)

About one minute long, Chopin's shortest, cute waltz, which is also called a "Puppy's Waltz"

Berceuse (lullaby) Op. 57

This delicate lullaby is built on a simple, repeated bass pattern. He created intricate variations—like a cradle gently rocking — showing his poetic touch, refined technique, and turn simplicity into beauty.

Sergei Rachmaninoff (1873 – 1943)

It is from Op 21 and song No 7 of a group of 12 songs written in 1902. In the literature, it is often referred to as a lovely song about admiring peaceful nature. This beautiful song will be sung in Russian.

Felix Mendelssohn (1809 – 1847)

Franz Schubert (1797 – 1828)

Frederic Chopin (1810 – 1849)

It opens with a haunting question, inspired by his nightmare where he stood at heaven's gate but rejected. This sense of pleading and rejection recurs throughout, with lyrical beauty with storms.

Fuling Chiang was born in Taiwan in January 1955. I came to the USA in 1980 and I am a retired small business owner. As a tenor, I sang for Alpharetta Community Chorus, Atlanta Chinese Christian Church North Choir and Chinese Eastern Choir. I have loved singing since I was young, however, I didn't start work on improving my voice until I was 57 years old. It's a bit late, but my passion for singing will never die. I love having the opportunity to sing and share my passion with others.

Kimber Kwiatkowski began playing for churches in an employee capacity at the age of 15, holding positions as pianist, organist and choirmaster. She earned her B.A. magna cum laude, majoring in music with a concentration in piano performance from Mercer University. She earned a J.D. from Mercer University's Walter F. George School of Law. After working in various private law firms and two Fortune 500 companies as in-house counsel, she now teaches piano. Kimber is President of GCMTA and Secretary of GMTA.

Chigusa Morimoto earned the degree of Bachelor of Vocal Music, Nagoya University of Arts, Japan, M.M. in Vocal Music, International college of music, Hamburg, Germany. She studied German songs, opera arias, and church music there. After that, she worked as a voice trainer in Japan for 5 years. She is living with her husband and daughter in Georgia since March 2021 due to her husband's work. She became a GMG member in the spring of 2023.

A life-altering illness years ago led Dr. Tanigawa to reconnect with music, which had been set aside for 45 years, igniting a powerful new chapter in her life.
